PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

LAST YEAR, IN HER DOHA DEBUT - SHE AND PARTNER JESSICA PEGULA CAPTURED THE DOUBLES TITLE, IN JUST THEIR THIRD EVENT AS A TEAM. AND IT WAS JUST THE BEGINNING OF A REMARKABLE SEASON ON TOUR. AT ROLAND GARROS, SHE REACHED THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH IN BOTH SINGLES AND DOUBLES, CAPTURED TWO MORE DOUBLES TITLES, CLAIMED THE WORLD #1 DOUBLES RANKING, CRACKED THE TOP-10 IN SINGLES - AND QUALIFIED FOR THE WTA FINALS IN BOTH DISCIPLINES. THIS YEAR, SHE'S PICKED-UP RIGHT WHERE SHE LEFT OFF - CAPTURING HER 3RD SINGLES TITLE IN AUCKLAND, AND REACHING THE DOUBLES SEMIFINALS AT THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN. BACK IN DOHA AS THE WORLD #6, FROM THE UNITED STATES - PLEASE WELCOME, COCO GAUFF.

SINCE CAPTURING HER FIRST WIMBLEDON TITLE 12-YEARS-AGO, SHE'S WON FANS THE WORLD OVER - AND WHAT A RIDE IT'S BEEN.
