PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2021, THIS 27-YEAR-OLD WAS SIMPLY UNSTOPPABLE - CAPTURING HIS FIRST GRAND SLAM SINGLES TITLE RIGHT HERE IN ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM, DROPPING ONLY A SINGLE SET EN-ROUTE TO THE TITLE, LIFTING HIS FIRST MAJOR TROPHY WITH A STRAIGHT-SETS VICTORY OVER WORLD #1 NOVAK DJOKOVIC. TODAY, TWO YEARS LATER, HE IS NOW A 4-TIME GRAND SLAM FINALIST, AN ATP FINALS CHAMPION, A DAVIS CUP CHAMPION, SPENT 16-WEEKS AS THE SPORT'S TOP-RANKED PLAYER - AND IN ALL, OWNS 20 ATP SINGLES TITLES, INCLUDING A CAREER-BEST FIVE TITLES THIS SEASON ALONE. NEW YORK, WELCOME BACK 2-TIME US OPEN FINALIST AND 2021 US OPEN CHAMPION, DANIIL MEDVEDEV.

AT 34-YEARS-OLD, HE OWNS 2 ATP CHALLENGER TOUR SINGLES TITLES, IS A 4-TIME CHALLENGER FINALIST - AND IN 2019, REACHED HIS FIRST TOUR-LEVEL FINAL IN UMAG - WINNING SIX CONSECUTIVE MATCHES TO REACH THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH AS A QUALIFIER. HERE IN NEW YORK, HE MADE HIS GRAND SLAM MAIN-DRAW DEBUT 3-YEARS-AGO, RIGHT HERE AT THE US OPEN - AND THIS AFTERNOON, USING A PROTECTED RANKING, FINDS HIMSELF ON CENTER COURT - ON THE SPORT'S BIGGEST STAGE - WITH EVERYTHING TO GAIN AND NOTHING TO LOSE. MAKING HIS ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM DEBUT - FROM HUNGARY, PLEASE WELCOME ATTILA BALAZS.
