PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2017 - AT JUST 13-YEARS-OLD - SHE BECAME THE YOUNGEST JUNIOR FINALIST IN US OPEN HISTORY. TODAY, SIX YEARS LATER (AND STILL A TEENAGER), SHE...IS ONE OF AMERICA'S MARQUEE TALENTS. RANKED INSIDE THE TOP-10 IN BOTH SINGLES AND DOUBLES, SHE NOW OWNS 6 WTA SINGLES TITLES, 8 DOUBLES TITLES, IS A 3-TIME GRAND SLAM DOUBLES FINALIST, AND LAST SUMMER - BECAME THE #1 DOUBLES PLAYER IN THE WORLD. THIS YEAR, SHE'S CRUSHING IT AGAIN - CAPTURING FIVE TITLES (SINGLES AND DOUBLES), INCLUDING THE SINGLES TITLES IN WASHINGTON D.C. AND HER FIRST WTA-1000 TITLE EARLIER THIS MONTH IN CINCINNATI, WHERE SHE DEFEATED WORLD #1 IGA SWIATEK TO REACH THE FINAL. FROM DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA - NEW YORK, WELCOME BACK THE #6 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, COCO GAUFF.

PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

AT JUST 16-YEARS-OLD, SHE HAS EXPLODED ONTO THE SCENE IN 2023. A JUNIOR FINALIST AT THIS YEAR'S AUSTRALIAN OPEN - SHE WENT-ON TO CAPTURE 2 ITF WOMEN'S CIRCUIT SINGLES TITLES, AND BECAME FRONT-PAGE NEWS AT THE MAJORS. AT ROLAND GARROS, AS A QUALIFIER - SHE REACHED THE 3RD-ROUND IN HER GRAND SLAM DEBUT. THEN AT WIMBLEDON, SHE QUALIFIED AGAIN, AND WON 6 CONSECUTIVE MATCHES TO REACH THE ROUND OF 16. SHE STARTED THE YEAR RANKED OUTSIDE THE TOP-250. THIS AFTERNOON, SHE MAKES HER ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM DEBUT AS THE WORLD #63. PLEASE WELCOME, ONE OF THE FASTEST RISING STARS ON TOUR, MIRRA ANDREEVA.
