EARLIER THIS YEAR, AS A QUALIFIER AT ROLAND GARROS - HE MADE HIS CAREER-BEST RUN AT A MAJOR - EARNING 6 CONSECUTIVE MATCH VICTORIES TO REACH THE ROUND OF 16.
