PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

TONIGHT, AT JUST 19-YEARS-OLD, SHE TAKES CENTER STAGE AT HER HOME SLAM, UNDER THE LIGHTS ON THE SPORT'S BIGGEST STAGE - AS THE YOUNGEST AMERICAN US OPEN FINALIST SINCE SERENA WILLIAMS IN 1999. AND THIS SUMMER, SHE HAS BEEN EXTRAORDINARY - CAPTURING TWO TITLES, INCLUDING HER FIRST WTA-1000 SINGLES TITLE IN CINCINNATI, WHERE SHE DEFEATED WORLD #1 IGA SWIATEK TO REACH THE CHAMPIONSHIP MATCH. A ROLAND GARROS FINALIST LAST YEAR (IN BOTH SINGLES AND DOUBLES) - TONIGHT, SHE COMES INTO HER FIRST US OPEN SINGLES FINAL ON AN 11 MATCH WIN STREAK - AND WITH A VICTORY, WILL CLIMB TO A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #3. FROM DEPRAY BEACH, FLORIDA - PLEASE WELCOME COCO GAUFF.
