THE REIGNING OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST, HE'S A 2-TIME ATP FINALS CHAMPION, HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #2 - AND THIS SUMMER, ON THE CLAY IN HAMBURG, CAPTURED HIS 20TH CAREER ATP SINGLES TITLE.
