ALSO MAKING HER 13TH US OPEN APPEARANCE - THIS 28-YEAR-OLD MADE HER GRAND SLAM MAIN DRAW DEBUT HERE IN NEW YORK AT JUST 16-YEARS-OLD IN 2011 - AND 6 YEARS LATER, CAPTIVATED ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM WITH HER BLISTERING FOREHANDS, POWERING THROUGH THE FIELD TO REACH THE 2017 US OPEN FINAL. RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #7, SHE NOW OWNS 7 WTA SINGLES TITLES, IS A 12-TIME FINALIST ON TOUR - AND IN 2016, REACHED THE BRONZE MEDAL MATCH AT THE OLYMPIC GAMES IN RIO AND QUALIFIED FOR THE YEAR-END WTA FINALS. FROM ROCK ISLAND, ILLINOIS - NEW YORK, WELCOME BACK 2017 US OPEN FINALIST, MADISON KEYS.

## PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

ON TUESDAY, THIS 33-YEAR-OLD DEFEATED 2010 US OPEN FINALIST VERA ZVONAREVA TO REACH TODAY'S 2ND-ROUND MATCH - AND THIS AFTERNOON, FINDS HERSELF BACK ON THE SPORT'S BIGGEST STAGE FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 14-YEARS. IN 2009, AT JUST 19-YEARS-OLD, SHE WON 5 CONSECUTIVE MATCHES HERE IN NEW YORK, AND MADE HER ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM DEBUT AS A US OPEN SEMIFINALIST. RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #12, SHE OWNS 5 WTA SINGLES TITLES, IS AN 11-TIME FINALIST - AND EARLIER THIS YEAR, CAPTURED HER 3RD WTA DOUBLES TITLE AT THE POLAND OPEN. COMPETING IN HER 13TH US OPEN - FROM BELGIUM, PLEASE WELCOME YANINA WICKMAYER.
