BACK ON CENTER STAGE IN ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM - WHERE LAST YEAR, HE LIFTED HIS FIRST GRAND SLAM SINGLES TROPHY - THIS 20-YEAR-OLD...HAS COMPLETELY TAKEN THE SPORT BY STORM. INCREDIBLY, IN JUST THREE SEASONS, HE HAS AMASSED 2 GRAND SLAM SINGLES TITLES, 4 MASTERS-1000 TITLES, CAPTURED 12 TITLES IN ALL, AND HELD THE SPORT'S TOP-RANKING FOR 35-WEEKS COMBINED. THIS YEAR ALONE, HE'S WON 6 OF THOSE TITLES - INCLUDING LAST MONTH'S DECIDING-SET TRIUMPH OVER NOVAK DJOKOVIC IN THE WIMBLEDON FINAL. PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

OVER THE SUMMER, THIS 33-YEAR-OLD CAPTURED HIS 2ND ATP SINGLES TITLE IN WASHINGTON DC, LEAPT TO A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #21 – AND THIS AFTERNOON, RETURNS TO THE SPORTS BIGGEST STAGE AT THE US OPEN, WHERE HE REACHED THE 4TH ROUND 2-YEARS-AGO. SINCE 2017, HE'S EARNED SIX CLUTCH VICTORIES OVER TOP-10 OPPONENTS – AND THE LAST TIME HE FACED THE SPORT'S TOP-RANKED PLAYER, HE ROSE TO THE CHALLENGE – DEFEATING WORLD #1 NOVAK DJOKOVIC ON THE CLAY IN MONTE CARLO EN-ROUTE TO HIS FIRST MASTERS-1000 SEMIFINAL. FROM GREAT BRITAIN, PLEASE WELCOME DAN EVANS.
