PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2017 - AT JUST 13-YEARS-OLD - SHE BECAME THE YOUNGEST JUNIOR FINALIST IN US OPEN HISTORY. TODAY, SIX YEARS LATER (AND STILL A TEENAGER), SHE...IS ONE OF AMERICA'S MARQUEE TALENTS. NOW A TOP-10 TALENT IN BOTH SINGLES AND DOUBLES, SHE OWNS 6 WTA SINGLES TITLES, 8 DOUBLES TITLES, IS A 3-TIME GRAND SLAM DOUBLES FINALIST, AND LAST SUMMER - BECAME THE #1 DOUBLES PLAYER IN THE WORLD. THROUGH TO ROUND-3 ON A 7-MATCH WIN-STREAK - LAST MONTH, SHE CAPTURED HER FIRST WTA-1000 SINGLES TITLE IN CINCINNATI, WHERE SHE DEFEATED WORLD #1 IGA SWIATEK TO REACH THE FINAL. FROM DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, WELCOME BACK THE #6 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, COCO GAUFF.

TODAY - JUST FOUR YEARS LATER - SHE IS NOW A 3-TIME GRAND SLAM DOUBLES CHAMPION, OWNS 17 DOUBLES TITLES IN ALL, AND HELD THE SPORT'S TOP DOUBLES RANKING FOR 21-WEEKS COMBINED. AND THERE'S NO QUESTION, SUCCESS IN DOUBLES...HAS MADE HER A FORMIDABLE THREAT WITHOUT A PARTNER. OVER THE PAST 6-YEARS, SHE'S CAPTURED 7 WTA SINGLES TITLES, IS AN 11-TIME FINALIST - AND IN 2018, REACHED THE SEMIFINALS OF THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN.
