NO MAN HAS WON MORE GRAND SLAM SINGLES TITLES. NO MAN HAS REACHED MORE GRAND SLAM SINGLES FINALS. NO OTHER MAN HAS EARNED THE CAREER GRAND SLAM <u>THREE TIMES</u>. AND NO OTHER PLAYER - MAN OR WOMAN - HAS SPENT MORE TIME AS THE SPORT'S TOP-RANKED PLAYER. WHEN IT COMES TO RECORDS, HE'S NEARLY TOPPLED THEM ALL - AND A WEEK FROM MONDAY, WILL REGAIN THE WORLD #1 RANKING FOR A 10TH TIME. IN ALL, HE'S NOW A 23-TIME GRAND SLAM CHAMPION, OWNS 95 CAREER SINGLES TITLES, AND WITH UNFLINCHING DETERMINATION OVER THE PAST 19-YEARS, HAS DEFIANTLY EARNED THE TITLE: <u>GREATEST OF ALL TIME</u>. AT 28-YEARS-OLD, HE OWNS 2 ATP SINGLES TITLES, HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #27 - AND OVER THE SUMMER, REACHED HIS 5TH TOUR-LEVEL FINAL ON THE CLAY IN HAMBURG. AT THE START OF THE SEASON, HE EARNED ONE OF THE BIGGEST VICTORIES OF HIS CAREER IN AUCKLAND - DEFEATING WORLD #3 AND LAST YEAR'S US OPEN FINALIST CASPER RUUD TO REACH THE QUARTERFINALS. THIS WEEK IN NEW YORK, WITH TWO STRAIGHT SETS VICTORIES, HE'S REACHED THE 3RD ROUND OF THE US OPEN FOR THE FIRST TIME - AND TONIGHT, MAKES HIS PRIMETIME DEBUT UNDER THE LIGHTS IN ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM.
