LAST YEAR, SHE CAPTURED 2 TITLES, REACHED HER FIRST GRAND SLAM SEMIFINAL AT ROLAND GARROS, MADE HER YEAR-END CHAMPIONSHIP DEBUT AT THE WTA FINALS - AND ENDED THE SEASON WITH A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #8.
