PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2016, AT JUST 20-YEARS-OLD, SHE TOOK PARIS BY STORM - CAPTURING HER FIRST GRAND SLAM SINGLES TITLE AT ROLAND GARROS - DEFEATING WORLD #4 SIMONA HALEP TO LIFT THE CHAMPION'S TROPHY ON CHATRIER. TODAY, 6 YEARS LATER, SHE OWNS 6 CAREER SINGLES TITLES, 6 DOUBLES TITLES, HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #5 - AND EARLIER THIS YEAR IN MELBOURNE, EARNED HER 18TH CAREER TOP-10 VICTORY, DEFEATING COCO GAUFF TO REACH THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN QUARTERFINALS. AND WITH THREE DECIDING-SET VICTORIES THIS WEEK IN NEW YORK - TONIGHT, SHE'S BACK ON THE SPORT'S BIGGEST STAGE, COMPETING IN THE US OPEN'S ROUND OF 16 FOR THE FIRST TIME.
