

PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2009 - SHE MADE HER DOHA DEBUT IN THE WTA FINALS - AS A BALL CRUSHING, FIERY 20-YEAR-OLD - POISED FOR GREATNESS. AND OVER THE PAST 15-YEARS - WITHOUT QUESTION - SHE'S LIVED-UP TO EXPECTATION. NOW A 2-TIME GRAND SLAM SINGLES CHAMPION, SHE OWNS 21 SINGLES TITLES IN ALL - HAS REACHED 41 CAREER FINALS - IS AN OLYMPIC GOLD AND BRONZE MEDALIST, AND HELD THE WORLD #1 RANKING FOR A TOTAL OF 51-WEEKS COMBINED. HERE IN DOHA, SHE'S ONE OF ONLY TWO PLAYERS WHO'VE WON BACK-TO-BACK TITLES - AND ONE OF ONLY TWO PLAYERS WHO'VE REACHED 3 CONSECUTIVE QATAR TOTAL ENERGIES OPEN FINALS. DOHA, WELCOME BACK - 2012 AND 2012 CHAMPION, VICTORIA AZARENKA.
