## PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

COMPETING IN HER 7TH QATAR TOTAL ENERGIES OPEN - THIS 27-YEAR-OLD IS A 7-TIME GRAND SLAM DOUBLES CHAMPION, AN OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST, A WTA FINALS DOUBLES CHAMPION, A BILLIE JEAN KING CUP CHAMPION - AND IS ONE OF JUST A HANDFUL OF PLAYERS IN TENNIS HISTORY WHO'VE EARNED THE CAREER GOLDEN SLAM, AND SUPER SLAM. IN FACT, SHE'S HELD THE SPORT'S TOP DOUBLES RANKING FOR OVER 2-YEARS COMBINED - AND OWNS 24 DOUBLES TITLES IN 40 CAREER FINALS. ALSO A 10-TIME SINGLES FINALIST -- LAST YEAR, SHE CAPPED THE SEASON BY REACHING BACK-TO-BACK FINALS IN HONG KONG AND NANCHANG, WHERE SHE CAPTURED HER 5TH WTA SINGLES TITLE. COMPETING IN HER 3RD QATAR TOTALENERGIES OPEN - THIS YEAR, SHE RETURNS TO DOHA WITH A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #3, AND AS THE REIGNING US OPEN CHAMPION. IN SEPTEMBER, SHE LIFTED HER FIRST GRAND SLAM TROPHY AT HER HOME SLAM IN NEW YORK - AND AT JUST 19-YEARS-OLD, HAS QUICKLY BECOME ONE OF THE GREATEST TALENTS ON TOUR. LAST MONTH, SHE STARTED THE NEW SEASON BY CAPTURING HER 7TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE IN AUCKLAND - AND IN MELBOURNE, REACHED THE SEMIFINALS AT THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN. HERE IN DOHA, SHE REMAINS UNDEFEATED IN DOUBLES - AFTER CAPTURING BACK-TO-BACK TITLES WITH JESSICA PEGULA IN 2022 AND 2023. FROM THE UNITED STATES - WELCOME BACK THE #3 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, COCO GAUFF.
