COMPETING IN HER 7TH QATAR TOTAL ENERGIES OPEN - THIS 27-YEAR-OLD IS A 7-TIME GRAND SLAM DOUBLES CHAMPION, AN OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST, A WTA FINALS DOUBLES CHAMPION, A BILLIE JEAN KING CUP CHAMPION - AND IS ONE OF JUST A HANDFUL OF PLAYERS IN TENNIS HISTORY WHO'VE EARNED THE CAREER GOLDEN SLAM, AND SUPER SLAM. IN FACT, SHE'S HELD THE SPORT'S TOP DOUBLES RANKING FOR OVER 2-YEARS COMBINED - AND OWNS 24 DOUBLES TITLES IN 40 CAREER FINALS. ALSO A 10-TIME SINGLES FINALIST -- LAST YEAR, SHE CAPPED THE SEASON BY REACHING BACK-TO-BACK FINALS IN HONG KONG AND NANCHANG, WHERE SHE CAPTURED HER 5TH WTA SINGLES TITLE. IN SEPTEMBER, SHE LIFTED HER FIRST GRAND SLAM TROPHY AT HER HOME SLAM IN NEW YORK - AND AT JUST 19-YEARS-OLD, HAS QUICKLY BECOME ONE OF THE GREATEST TALENTS ON TOUR. LAST MONTH, SHE STARTED THE NEW SEASON BY CAPTURING HER 7TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE IN AUCKLAND - AND IN MELBOURNE, REACHED THE SEMIFINALS AT THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN.
