A 2-TIME DOHA CHAMPION AND 3-TIME FINALIST - THIS WEEK, SHE DEFEATED QUALIFIER MAGDALENA FRECH AND WANG XINYU, EARNING TONIGHT'S SPOT IN THE ROUND OF 16 FOR A 5TH TIME. SINCE HER DOHA DEBUT AT THE WTA FINALS 15-YEARS-AGO, SHE HAS STAMPED HER LEGACY AS ONE OF THE SPORT'S TOP TALENTS OF THE PAST TWO DECADES -- SHE'S A 2-TIME GRAND SLAM SINGLES CHAMPION, OWNS 21 SINGLES TITLES IN ALL - HAS REACHED 41 CAREER FINALS - IS AN OLYMPIC GOLD AND BRONZE MEDALIST - AND HELD THE WORLD #1 RANKING FOR A TOTAL OF 51-WEEKS COMBINED.
