PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

IN 2020, AT JUST 20-YEARS-OLD - SHE REACHED THE 3RD-ROUND IN HER DOHA DEBUT, IN WHAT BECAME HER BREAK-OUT SEASON ON TOUR. NOW, IN JUST FOUR SHORT YEARS - SHE HAS QUICKLY BECOME ONE THE WTA'S GREATEST TALENTS. SHE'S A WIMBLEDON CHAMPION, AN AUSTRALIAN OPEN FINALIST, HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #3, REACHED THE BRONZE MEDAL MATCH AT THE OLYMPICS IN TOKYO - AND ON SUNDAY NIGHT IN ABU DHABI, CAPTURED HER 7TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE; HER SECOND TOURNAMENT TRIUMPH THIS YEAR. COMPETING IN HER 5TH WTA-1000 SEMIFINAL, FROM KAZAKHASTAN - PLEASE WELCOME THE #4 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, ELENA RYBAKINA.

TODAY, 15-YEARS-LATER, SHE NOW OWNS 37 TOP-10 VICTORIES - INCLUDING A TRIUMPH THIS WEEK OVER WORLD #8 AND REIGNING WIMBLEDON CHAMPION MARKETAVONDROUSOVA. SHE'S A ROLAND GARROS FINALIST, AN OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST, A BILLIE JEAN KING CUP CHAMPION AND IN ALL, OWNS 12 WTA SINGLES TITLES IN 21 CAREER FINALS. COMPETING IN HER 4TH WTA-1000 SEMIFINAL - PLEASE WELCOME, ANASTASIA PAVLYUCHENKOVA.
