IN 2014, HE MADE HIS GRAND SLAM MAIN DRAW DEBUT RIGHT HERE AT THE US OPEN, BECOMING THE FIRST PLAYER FROM HIS COUNTRY EVER TO QUALIFY AT A MAJOR. TONIGHT, AS A QUALIFIER AGAIN – HE MAKES HIS 30TH GRAND SLAM MAIN DRAW APPEARANCE IN PRIME TIME, UNDER THE LIGHTS IN NEW YORK – AGAINST ONE OF THE GREATEST TALENTS THE SPORT HAS EVER KNOWN. IN ALL, HE OWNS 1 ATP SINGLES TITLE, 9 CHALLENGER TITLES – AND IN 2018, WAS A US OPEN DOUBLES SEMIFINALIST ALONGSIDE MALEK JAZIRI. MAKING HIS ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM DEBUT – FROM MOLDOVA, PLEASE WELCOME RADU ALBOT.
