EARLIER THIS YEAR AT ROLAND GARROS, SHE CAPTURED HER FIRST GRAND SLAM DOUBLES TITLE - AND IN ALL (AT ONLY 20-YEARS-OLD), IS NOW A 5-TIME GRAND SLAM FINALIST. BACK UNDER THE LIGHTS IN ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM, IN FRONT OF A PACKED HOUSE AT HER HOME SLAM - FROM DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA - PLEASE WELCOME DEFENDING US OPEN CHAMPION, COCO GAUFF.

TONIGHT, SHE TAKES CENTER STAGE IN NEW YORK, IN HER ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM DEBUT, AGAINST THE DEFENDING US OPEN CHAMPION. COMPETING IN HER 44TH MAJOR MAIN-DRAW - SHE OWNS 3 WTA SINGLES TITLES, 4 DOUBLES TITLES - AND STARTED THE SEASON WITH A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #42, HELPING LIFT HER COUNTRY TO THE 2024 UNITED CUP TITLE.
