PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

NOW A 5-TIME GRAND SLAM CHAMPION - EARLIER THIS YEAR, SHE CAPTURED HER 4TH ROLAND GARROS TITLE - THEN RETURNED TO THE CLAY IN PARIS THIS SUMMER, WHERE SHE CLAIMED OLYMPIC BRONZE. AT JUST 23-YEARS-OLD - SHE IS THE REIGNING WTA FINALS CHAMPION, HAS AMASSED 22 CAREER SINGLES TITLES, IS A 2-TIME YEAR-END WORLD #1 - AND EARLIER THIS YEAR, BECAME ONE OF ONLY 8 WOMEN IN HISTORY TO HOLD THE SPORT'S TOP-RANKING FOR OVER 100-WEEKS COMBINED. FROM POLAND - NEW YORK, WELCOME BACK 2022 US OPEN CHAMPION, AND THE #1 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, IGA SWIATEK.
