THE REIGNING AND 2-TIME BRITISH NATIONAL CHAMPION - THIS 29-YEAR-OLD RETURNS TO DOHA'S LAST-16 AFTER A RELENTLESS, UNSHAKABLE TRIUMPH OVER PAUL COLL IN MONDAY'S 1ST-ROUND. A 2-TIME Q-TERMINALS QATAR CLASSIC SEMIFINALIST - AND 6-TIME PLATINUM SEMIFINALIST OVERALL - HE'S BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #7, HAS SPENT OVER 4-YEARS AS ONE OF THE SPORT'S TOP-10 TALENTS, AND HAS QUALIFIED FOR THE YEAR-END PSA SQUASH-TOUR-FINALS THREE TIMES, REACHING THE FINAL-4 IN HIS 2020 DEBUT. LAST SEASON, HE CAPTURED HIS 2ND PSA SILVER TITLE AT THE MANCHESTER OPEN - AND IN ALL, NOW OWNS 6 TITLES IN 18 CAREER FINALS. FROM WALES -PLEASE WELCOME WORLD #9, THE GOLDEN TIGER: JOEL MAKIN.

COMPETING IN HIS 4TH Q-TERMINALS QATAR CLASSIC - ON MONDAY, DOWN 2-GAMES TO NONE, HE FLIPPED THE SCRIPT ON WORLD #18 GREG LOBBAN - DISPATCHING SCOTLAND'S TOP-TALENT IN A 5-GAME, 71-MINUTE LUNG-BUSTER - THE BIGGEST PLATINUM MATCH VICTORY OF HIS CAREER. RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #21 - HE OWNS 13 PSA CHALLENGER TITLES, IS A 23-TIME FINALIST - AND THIS AFTERNOON, STEPS INTO THE SPOTLIGHT ON DOHA'S GLASS COURT - WITH A SHOT AT ONE OF THE SPORT'S ELITE TOP-10 TALENTS -- A SPOT IN HIS FIRST CAREER PLATINUM QUARTERFINAL, ON THE LINE.
