PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

A ROLAND GARROS SINGLES AND US OPEN DOUBLES CHAMPION - OVER THE PAST 9-YEARS, SHE HAS BECOME ONE OF THE MOST FAMILIAR FACES HERE IN DOHA. IN 2016, AT JUST 18-YEARS-OLD, SHE REACHED THE SINGLES FINAL IN HER DOHA DEBUT. TWO YEARS LATER, SHE WON THE DOUBLES TITLE - AND TO THIS DAY, REMAINS ONE OF ONLY 3 TALENTS IN TOURNAMENT HISTORY WHO'VE REACHED THE DOHA DOUBLES FINAL FOUR TIMES. REMARKABLY, FIVE OF HER 23 CAREER TOP-10 TRIUMPHS HAVE COME ON THIS COURT - INCLUDING LAST NIGHT'S OVER-POWERING PERFORMANCE AGAINST 3-TIME AND DEFENDING CHAMPION, IGA SWIATEK. BACK, CENTER STAGE IN QATAR - COMPETING IN HER 6TH DOHA FINAL - FROM LATVIA - PLEASE WELCOME, JELENA OSTAPENKO.
