IN 2020, DURING HER BREAK-OUT SEASON, SHE MADE HER DOHA DEBUT AT JUST 20-YEARS-OLD. FIVE YEARS LATER, SHE IS ONE OF THE SPORT'S GREATEST TALENTS . . .
