PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

A ROLAND GARROS SINGLES CHAMPION AND US OPEN DOUBLES CHAMPION - IN ALL, OVER THE PAST DECADE, SHE HAS AMASSED 8 SINGLES TITLES, 10 DOUBLES TITLES, AND ACHIEVED TOP-5 STATUS IN BOTH DISCIPLINES. A FAMILIAR FACE HERE ON DOHA'S CENTER COURT - IN 2016, AT JUST 18-YEARS-OLD, SHE REACHED THE SINGLES FINAL IN HER DOHA DEBUT. TWO YEARS LATER, SHE WON THE DOUBLES TITLE - AND TO THIS DAY, REMAINS ONE OF ONLY 3 TALENTS IN TOURNAMENT HISTORY WHO'VE REACHED THE DOHA DOUBLES FINAL FOUR TIMES. NOT SURPRISINGLY, FOUR OF HER 22 CAREER TOP-10 TRIUMPHS HAVE COME ON THIS COURT - INCLUDING YESTERDAY'S LASER-FOCUSED, STRAIGHT-SETS WIN OVER WORLD #4 JASMINE PAOLINI. IN PURSUIT OF HER 8TH WTA-1000 SEMIFINAL . . . FROM LATVIA - PLEASE WELCOME JELENA OSTAPENKO.
