LAST YEAR, SHE REACHED THE ROUND OF 16 HERE IN DOHA FOR THE FIRST TIME, WHERE SHE FELL TO 3-TIME CHAMPION IGA SWIATEK. BUT JUST A MONTH LATER IN MIAMI . . . SHE DEFEATED THE WORLD #1 IN STRAIGHT-SETS - THEN KNOCKED-OFF WORLD #5 JESSICA PEGULA TO REACH HER 2ND CAREER WTA-1000 SEMIFINAL. RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #16, SHE'S A BILLIE JEAN KING CUP CHAMPION, A 9-TIME TOUR-LEVEL FINALIST - AND JUST 7 NIGHTS AGO IN AUSTRIA, CAPTURED HER 5TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE, DEFEATING DARIA YASTREMSKA IN A DECIDING-SET TO LIFT THE TROPHY IN LINZ. LAST SEASON, SHE UPSET WORLD #5 JESSICA PEGULA IN EASTBOURNE, WORLD #9 MARIA SAKKARI AT WIMBLEDON, LED TEAM-GB TO THE BILLIE JEAN KING CUP SEMIFINALS, AND BROKE BACK INSIDE THE WTA'S TOP-60.
