PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

THROUGH TO ROUND-2 FOLLOWING SUNDAY'S STRAIGHT-SETS VICTORY OVER WILD CARD EMMA RADUCANU - SHE IS A BILLIE JEAN KING CUP CHAMPION, A 9-TIME TOUR-LEVEL FINALIST, HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #16 - AND JUST 9 NIGHTS AGO IN AUSTRIA, CAPTURED HER 5TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE IN LINZ. LAST YEAR, SHE REACHED THE ROUND OF 16 HERE IN DOHA FOR THE FIRST TIME, WHERE SHE FELL TO 3-TIME CHAMPION IGA SWIATEK. BUT JUST A MONTH LATER IN MIAMI . . . SHE DEFEATED THE WORLD #1 IN STRAIGHT-SETS EN-ROUTE TO HER 2ND CAREER WTA-1000 SEMIFINAL. IN PURSUIT OF HER 2ND CAREER TRIUMPH OVER A WORLD #1 - DOHA, WELCOME BACK EKATERINA ALEXANDROVA.

TODAY, JUST FIVE YEARS LATER - SHE IS NOW A 3-TIME GRAND SLAM SINGLES CHAMPION, A 5-TIME MAJOR FINALIST, OWNS 7 WTA-1000 TITLES, AND HAS HELD THE WORLD #1 RANKING FOR 25-WEEKS COMBINED. (11-1) TO START THE NEW SEASON - LAST MONTH, SHE CAPTURED HER 18TH CAREER SINGLES TITLE IN BRISBANE, AND MADE HER 3RD CONSECUTIVE RUN TO THE AUSTRALIAN OPEN FINAL.
