PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

THE DEFENDING AND ONLY 3-TIME DOHA CHAMPION . . . AT JUST 23-YEARS-OLD - SHE IS A 5-TIME GRAND SLAM CHAMPION, A WTA FINALS CHAMPION, AN OLYMPIC BRONZE MEDALIST, HAS HELD THE WORLD #1 RANKING FOR 125-WEEKS COMBINED, AND IS A 2-TIME YEAR-END WORLD #1. REMARKABLY, IN JUST FIVE SEASONS, SHE HAS AMASSED 22 SINGLES TITLES IN 26 CAREER FINALS (INCLUDING A HAUL OF 10 WTA-1000 TROPHIES) . . . AND ON MONDAY, EARNED HER 13TH CONSECUTIVE MATCH VICTORY ON THIS COURT, DISPATCHING FORMER WORLD #3 MARIA SAKKARI TO RETURN TO THE ROUND OF 16. FROM POLAND - PLEASE WELCOME THE #2 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, IGA SWIATEK.

WITH VICTORIES THIS WEEK OVER OLYMPIC SILVER MEDALIST DONNA VEKIC AND YULIA PUTINTSEVA - AT JUST 20-YEARS-OLD, SHE FINDS HERSELF CENTER STAGE IN DOHA, IN THE FIRST WTA-1000 EVENT OF THE SEASON, WITH ANOTHER SHOT AT A TOP-10 TRIUMPH. LAST YEAR IN MELBOURNE, SHE EARNED HER FIRST VICTORY OVER A WORLD #1 AND REACHED THE QUARTERFINALS OF A MAJOR FOR THE FIRST TIME. HERE IN DOHA - SHE KNOCKED-OUT WORLD #9 MARIA SAKKARI. AND OVER THE SUMMER, CAPTURED HER FIRST WTA SINGLES TITLE IN MONTERREY, TO CLIMB TO A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #25.
