PLAYER BIOGRAPHY

A ROLAND GARROS SINGLES CHAMPION AND US OPEN DOUBLES CHAMPION - IN ALL, OVER THE PAST DECADE, SHE HAS AMASSED 8 SINGLES TITLES, 10 DOUBLES TITLES, AND HAS ACHIEVED TOP-5 STATUS IN BOTH DISCIPLINES. A FAMILIAR FACE ON CENTER COURT HERE IN DOHA - IN 2016, AT JUST 18-YEARS-OLD, SHE REACHED THE SINGLES FINAL IN HER DOHA DEBUT. TWO YEARS LATER, SHE WON THE DOUBLES TITLE - AND TO THIS DAY, REMAINS ONE OF ONLY 3 TALENTS IN TOURNAMENT HISTORY WHO'VE REACHED THE DOHA DOUBLES FINAL FOUR TIMES. THREE OF HER 21 CAREER TOP-10 TRIUMPHS HAVE COME ON THIS COURT. THIS AFTERNOON . . . SHE'S DETERMINED TO MAKE IT FOUR. FROM LATVIA - PLEASE WELCOME JELENA OSTAPENKO.

BACK IN DOHA WITH A CAREER-HIGH RANKING OF WORLD #4 - LAST YEAR, SHE REACHED HER FIRST TWO GRAND SLAM SINGLES FINALS BACK-TO-BACK (AT ROLAND GARROS AND WIMBLEDON) - CAPTURED HER FIRST WTA-1000 SINGLES TITLE IN DUBAI - TOPPED THE DOUBLES PODIUM IN PARIS (EARNING OLYMPIC GOLD ALONSIDE SARA ERRANI) - AND FOR THE FIRST TIME, COMPLETED THE SEASON AS A TOP-5 TALENT, COMPETING IN THE YEAR-END WTA FINALS IN BOTH SINGLES AND DOUBLES. BUT EVEN THEN, SHE WASN'T DONE. IN NOVEMBER, SHE LED HER COUNTRY TO ITS FIRST BILLIE JEAN KING CUP TITLE IN OVER A DECADE. FROM ITALY - PLEASE WELCOME THE #4 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, JASMINE PAOLINI.
