THROUGH TO THE US OPEN QUARTERFINALS FOR THE FIRST TIME – IT'S BEEN A YEAR TO REMEMBER FOR THIS 23-YEAR-OLD RISING STAR. IN JANUARY, HE LAUNCHED THE SEASON BY LIFTING THE TROPHY IN BRISBANE, DEFEATING WORLD #10 GRIGOR DIMIROV TO REACH THE FINAL. IN DOHA – HE TOOK-OUT THE WORLD #3. AND THIS SUMMER AT QUEEN'S CLUB – EARNED A DECIDING-SET TRIUMPH OVER WORLD #6 JACK DRAPER. IN ALL, HE NOW OWNS 2 ATP SINGLES TITLES ...
