IN 2023, AT JUST 19-YEARS-OLD, SHE BECAME THE YOUNGEST US OPEN SINGLES CHAMPION SINCE SERENA WILLIAMS IN 1999 - DEFEATING ARYNA SABALENKA TO CAPTURE HER MAIDEN GRAND SLAM TITLE. TONIGHT, SHE'S BACK UNDER THE LIGHTS IN ARTHUR ASHE STADIUM ... AS THE REIGNING ROLAND GARROS CHAMPION. DOWN A SET IN PARIS - SHE CAME BACK TO EARN HER 4TH CAREER TRIUMPH OVER A WORLD #1, ONCE AGAIN DEFEATING ARYNA SABALENKA TO LIFT THE TROPHY. REMARKABLY, AT JUST 21-YEARS-OLD, SHE ALREADY OWNS 10 CAREER SINGLES TITLES, 10 DOUBLES TITLES, AND HAS BEEN RANKED AS HIGH AS WORLD #2 IN SINGLES, AND WORLD #1 IN DOUBLES. FROM DELRAY BEACH FLORIDA - FANS, GIVE IT UP 2023 US OPEN CHAMPION AND THE #3 PLAYER IN THE WORLD, COCO GAUFF.
